Navigation:

1. Ability to understand orders and to communicate with the officer of the watch on matters relevant to watchkeeping duties.
2. Procedures for the relief, maintenance and handover of a watch.
3. Information required to maintain a safe watch.
4. Working knowledge of the mooring system and related procedures
5. Working knowledge of the procedures and order of events associated with mooring to a buoy or buoys.

Cargo handling and stowage:

6. Knowledge of procedures for safe handling, stowage and securing of cargoes and stores including dangerous, hazardous and harmful substances and liquids.
7. Basic knowledge of and precautions to observe in connection with particular types of cargo and identification of IMDG labeling.

Controlling the operation of the ship and care for persons on board:

8. Knowledge of deck equipment
9. Knowledge of the following procedures and ability to
10. Use and handling of deck and cargo-handling gear and equipment:
11. Knowledge of hoisting and dipping flags and the main single-flag signals. (A, B, G, H, O, P, Q).
12. Working knowledge of safe working practices and personal shipboard safety
13. Knowledge of the precautions to be taken to prevent pollution of the marine environment.
14. Knowledge of the use and operation of anti-pollution equipment.
15. Knowledge of the approved methods for disposal of marine pollutants.
16. Knowledge of the operation of survival craft and rescue boats, their launching appliances and arrangements and their equipment.
17. Knowledge of survival at sea techniques.

Maintenance and repair:

18. Ability to use painting, lubrication and cleaning materials and equipment.
19. Ability to understand and execute routine maintenance and repair procedures.
20. Knowledge of surface preparation techniques.
21. Understanding manufacturer's safety guidelines and shipboard instructions.
22. Knowledge of safe disposal of waste materials.
23. Knowledge of the application, maintenance and use of hand and power tools.
